## A BILL TO IMPLEMENT THE SIMPLE RETURN TO REDUCE THE COST TO TAXPAYERS AND THE IRS FOR TAX FILING

1	BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:		
2	Article I:	The Simple Return Policy will be implemented to allow pre-filed tax	
3		returns to be sent to taxpayers with sufficiently simple finances.	
4	Article II:	The following terms are defined:	
5		A. Taxpayers with sufficiently simple finances shall be defined as:	
6		1. Taxpayers who had nothing but wage income, and	
7		2. Did not itemize, and	
8		3. Had no other credits on their last return.	
9		B. Prefilled Tax Returns are defined as: A tax form compiled by the IRS	
10		using pre-received information from employers and consumer banks.	
11	Article III:	This policy will go into effect January 1, 2019.	
12	Article IV:	The Internal Revenue System will oversee implementation and	
13		enforcement of the Simple Return Policy.	
14	Article V:	All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.	

## A BILL TO FORCE INTERNET SERVICE PROVIDERS TO COMPETE

## 1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

- 2 Article I. Internet service providers operating within the US are required to undergo
- 3 local loop unbundling.
- 4 Article II. Local loop unbundling will be defined as leasing the last mile of
- 5 infrastructure to other internet service providers.
- Internet service provider will be defined as an organization that provides
- 7 services accessing and using the Internet.
- 8 Article III. This legislation will be implemented immediately following passage.
- 9 Article IV. The FCC will oversee the implementation of this legislation.
- 10 Article V. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

## A BILL TO SUSPEND ANTI-TERROR FUNDING TO STOP HUMAN RIGHTS VIOLATIONS

1	BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:	
2	Article I:	Countries eligible for African Growth and Opportunity Act benefits must
3		submit to an investigation into human rights violations by either the
4		Secretary of State or the African Union. Any country found to have
5		serious human rights violations by either party will have 5 years to show
6		significant progress on restoring those rights, which will be determined by
7		another investigation.
8	Article II:	"Human rights violations" will be defined as a deprivation of any right
9		enumerated in the Universal Declaration of Human Rights. Sufficient
10		progress will be determined by the investigating party.
11	Article III:	This legislation will be implemented on October 1 <sup>st</sup> 2019.
12	Article IV:	The Secretary of State will enforce this legislation.
13		A. If a nation does not submit to an investigation by either party, the
14		United States will suspend all anti-terror funding to that nation and any
15		coalition of which the offending country is a member.
16		B. If insufficient progress is shown after the 5 year period, the United
17		States will suspend all anti-terror funding to that nation and any
18		coalition of which the offending country is a member.
19	Article V:	All other laws in conflict with this new policy shall hereby be declared
20		null and void.
