

A BILL TO INCENTIVIZE MANDATORY VACCINATIONS TO BETTER AMERICA'S HEALTH

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2 ARTICLE I: Any state which mandates full vaccination schedules for all children  
3 enrolled in public education shall receive an addition 2% of funding in  
4 support of primary or secondary education.

5 ARTICLE II: The list of required vaccinations shall be based on the immunization  
6 schedule recommended by the Center for Disease Control and Prevention  
7 for the specified age level of the student.

8 A. The sincerely held philosophical and religious beliefs of the parent or  
9 the student shall not be a defense to the provisions of this act.

10 B. The provisions of Section 1 shall not apply where a child is not  
11 vaccinated upon the certification of a physician who certifies that the  
12 student's health and physical condition would be endangered by such  
13 vaccination, and that the physician has made such judgment by  
14 conforming to the accepted standards of medical care.

15 ARTICLE III: This law shall go into effect on July 1<sup>st</sup>, 2019.

16 ARTICLE IV: The Department of Health and Human Services and the Department of  
17 Education will both oversee the compliance with this act.

18 A. The additional funds needed as incentives for participating public  
19 schools will be taken from the 2019 fiscal budget.

20 ARTICLE V. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A BILL TO ENSURE HEALTHY EATING HABITS AMONG SNAP RECIPIENTS

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2 Article I: Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (S.N.A.P.) recipients will  
3 receive 70% of their benefits in the form of F.A.R.M. (Federally Assisted  
4 Responsible Meals) food boxes once per month, which will consist of  
5 shelf-stable, healthy foods such as juices, grains, cereal, pasta, beans,  
6 canned meats, canned fruits and vegetables and other products to be  
7 determined by the U.S.D.A.

8 Article II: “Shelf-stable” will be defined as foods that can be safely stored at room  
9 temperature. “Healthy” will be defined as foods which meet the USDA’s  
10 *Dietary Guidelines for Americans*, 8<sup>th</sup> Edition.

11 Article III: This bill will go into effect fiscal year 2019.

12 Article IV: The U.S.D.A. will implement and oversee America’s F.A.R.M. Food Box  
13 program as a part of the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program  
14 (S.N.A.P.)

15 A. All products and foodstuffs in America’s F.A.R.M. Food Boxes will  
16 be bought wholesale from producers competing for placement and all  
17 products must be American-produced.

18 B. The U.S.D.A. will make available a range of F.A.R.M. food box  
19 choices to accommodate S.N.A.P. recipients’ religious and dietary  
20 preferences.

21 C. F.A.R.M. food boxes will be delivered to recipients’ domiciles.

22 Article V: All other laws in conflict with this bill are hereby declared null and void.

**THE SPACE EXPLORATION BILL OF 2018**

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2 Article I: \$25 billion shall be allocated to fund the exploration of space, our solar  
3 system and space related projects.

4 Article II: Let the exploration of space and our solar system be defined as the launch  
5 of satellites, probes and manned landings to the moon and other planets. It  
6 shall also include the establishment of a moon base that shall comprise of  
7 a series of structures built on the surface of the Earth's moon, operated by  
8 the United States for conducting space research, implementing space  
9 defense systems and for establishing a launch point for future space  
10 missions. Space related projects shall be projects including the research  
11 and creation of new shuttles and modes of transportation in space,  
12 satellites, space defense technology and technology and equipment that  
13 can be used for conducting research in space.

14 Article III: This bill will go into effect upon passage.

15 Article IV: The National Aeronautics and Space Administration and the Department  
16 of Defense shall be responsible for the use of these funds.

17 **A.** A. NASA will handle all funds being used for space exploration,  
18 research and related projects as well as the development of technology  
19 necessary for these projects.

20 **B.** B. The Department of Defense will handle all space defense research,  
21 working with NASA when necessary.

22 Article V: All other laws in conflict with this new policy shall hereby declared null  
23 and void.

A BILL TO MODIFY THE NATIONAL ORGAN TRANSPLANT ACT

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2 Article I: Title 42 Ch. 6A Subchapter 2 part H §274e subpoint C of the 1984  
3 National Organ Transplant Act will be modified to omit the term “bone  
4 marrow”. The sale of human bone marrow will thereby be legalized in all  
5 fifty states.

6 Article II: “Bone marrow” is defined for the purposes of this legislation as the soft  
7 fatty substance found in the cavities of the bones.

8 Article III: This bill will take effect on August 1, 2018.

9 Article IV: The Department of Health and Human Services will oversee  
10 administration of this legislation and will be charged with monitoring,  
11 regulating, and overseeing sales of bone marrow.

12 Article V. This bill supersedes all previous and conflicting legislation. .

**A RESOLUTION TO PRIORITIZE COUNTERTERRORISM EFFORTS OVER

- 1   Whereas:     Terrorism has ravaged the region of East Africa and generated regional  
2                    instability; and

4                    needed to train troops and stabilize the region; and
- 5   Whereas:     U.S. interests for business and national security are at stake; and
- 6   Whereas:     Strategically beating terrorism in East Africa will continue to spread legitimate  
7                    democracies in third world countries.
- 8   Therefore,    be it resolved by this NCFL Student Congress here assembled that  
9                    counterterrorism efforts be prioritized over humanitarian aid.
