A BILL TO END THE SALE OF ARMS TO SAUDI ARABIA

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2 Article I: The United States will cease all trades of arms and military intelligence to
3 the Saudi Arabian government.

4 Article II: Arms shall be defined as any instrument of war with the specific function
5 to harm individuals. Military intelligence shall be defined as information
6 and analysis designed to aid military operations during wartime.

7 Article III: This legislation shall be implemented immediately upon passage.

8 Article IV: The United States Department of Defense will oversee the implementation
9 of this legislation.

10 Article V: All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

**A BILL TO REFORM IMMIGRATION LAWS TO END DISCRIMINATION BASED ON
COUNTRY OF ORIGIN**

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2 Article I: No restriction shall be imposed on immigration on the basis of national
3 origin, with the exception of the restrictions outlined in this bill. Any
4 person who has entered the United States without authorization shall not
5 be deported but will follow the process outlined below.

6 Article II: The below exclusions and procedures will be followed.

7 A. Immigration is disallowed by persons departing from nations currently
8 at war with the U.S. or any coalition including the U.S., unless they
9 either claim asylum or assist the U.S. or an ally thereof in the conflict.

10 B. Each new immigrant must have a place of residence within the
11 territory of the U.S. or an intended place of residence upon arrival, and
12 a place of occupation unless admitted under EB Visas.

13 C. The “Reason to Believe” provision will be abolished. Persons rejected
14 solely for failing the provision will be admitted as if they had passed.
15 Persons on the terrorist watch list or the equivalent thereof shall be
16 barred from entering the U.S. for any purpose unless they intend to
17 plead before a court of law or appropriate authority to have their name
18 removed from the list.

19 Article III: This legislation shall take effect on January 1, 2020.

20 Article IV: The Department of Homeland Security through U.S. Immigration and
21 Customs Enforcement will oversee the enforcement of this bill.

22 Article V: All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.
