STUDENT CONGRESS INFORMATION FOR DIOCESAN MODERATORS AND COACHES

Every league participating in Student Congress at NCFL Grand Nationals may submit ONE piece of legislation, either a Bill or Resolution.

Legislation should be in MS Word format and use the templates found on the NCFL website at <http://ncfl.org/student-congress>.

All Student Congress legislation is due by April 2, 2021. Legislation should be sent to congress@ncfl.org.

All of the rules, ballots, and procedures for Student Congress at NCFL Grand Nationals are found on the above website. All of your students, coaches, and judges should read them and understand them. If there are questions, please submit them to congress@ncfl.org or to Roland Burdett at rburdett@ncfl.org.

The packet of Bills and Resolutions that will be used for the dockets for the Preliminary, Quarter Finals, Semi Finals, and Final Session of Student Congress will be released on/about April 25th. It will be posted online at NCFL.org and at NCFLNationals.org as well as uploaded to TABROOM.com. From the submitted legislation, 12 will be chosen for prelims, 4 used in quarters, 4 in semis, and 5 will be identified for use in the Final Super Session.

Students will not learn their Chamber Assignments until Friday, May 28, 2021 just prior to the first Congress session.

With the increased participation around the country we now need up to 30 Parliamentarians to run the tournament. All leagues with 4 or more participants in Student Congress must provide a judge that is a qualified, experienced Parliamentarian. Parliamentarians from all leagues are welcome, but those entering 4 or more students are required to provide them. These persons should expect to be Parliamentarians on Friday/Saturday and/or Sunday.
